### **≻Outdoor Gatherings**

- Must follow current State Social Distancing protocols (Capacity/crowd-size limits, 6 ft. spacing, no physical contact, etc.)
- Masks are required for all attendees
- Establish seating with 6 ft. distances between "family units"
  - · Attendees are to bring their own seating
  - "Family Unit" is defined as household family members and/or people who arrived in shared vehicles
- Bathrooms will be available
  - Limited to one person (or parent/child) at a time
  - Must sanitize all touched surfaces using provided cleaning products after use.
- Physical activities (outdoor games)
  - Masks are required at a times
- Food/beverages
  - Individuals may bring personal coffees/drinks/food if desired, not to be shared
  - It is recommended that any food/beverages provided to attendees be individually prepackaged.
  - If prepared food is to be served, it should be handled only by designated preparers/servers
    - Preparers/Servers must wear gloves & mask when handling food
